Your section has had a dynamic spring! On April 8, we held our annual general meeting in hybrid format at the Centre St-Pierre. This format boosted member participation, a sign of your renewed engagement. A big thank you to the board members and all our volunteers for their outstanding work in organizing this event.

From May 6 to 8, the six sections of the Quebec District met in Montebello, in the presence of National President Roy Goodall, for a strategic working meeting. At the heart of the discussions were: the state of the Quebec network, regional priorities for the coming months, and avenues of influence within the national committees.

On May 27 and 28, the new board met to develop our 2025–2026 strategic plan. Three priorities will guide our actions: improving member services, strengthening our advocacy efforts, and developing new partnerships. In line with this, we signed an agreement in April with *Aidexpress*, a Quebec-based company offering personalized home care services, ranging from senior assistance to nursing care and support for caregivers.

In 2026, our section will celebrate its 60th anniversary. This will be a wonderful opportunity to celebrate our community's commitment! At the national level, I am taking part in the special committee on the Association's structure, tasked with evaluating the relevance of the current geographic boundaries of the seventy-seven (77) sections and their capacity to effectively serve members. This foundational work is unprecedented and vital to the future of our national network.

Our conferences remain popular and are being shared among the Quebec sections. This collaboration allows us to offer diverse content tailored to your interests while avoiding duplication.

Finally, we have strengthened our partnerships: with the Quebec Public Servants' Council, we participated in the workplace charity campaign and marked National Public Service Week. Thanks to the Canada Revenue Agency, we were also able to present the association during retirement planning sessions, even though these are now held exclusively online.

Summer tends to be a quieter season, so I wish you a relaxing and restful summer. I look forward to reconnecting with you in the fall!

Advocacy, Sylvie d'Alcantara, Administrator

An annual strategic meeting was held on May 27 and 28 with all members of the Board of Directors. Sylvie Rocheleau, Québec district representative at the national level, has attended the meeting. This meeting allowed us to review the goals and actions of all committees, particularly the Advocacy Committee, to stay on course and adjust as needed.

The national advocacy policy is still in development. Following the district meeting held on April 22, attended by our president Jacques Lambert and Sylvie Rocheleau, increased collaboration between districts is being considered.

On May 13, Prime Minister Mark Carney announced the composition of Canada's new Cabinet. Click the following link to see the list of ministers: **The New Cabinet**. In addition, the Cabinet is supported by 10 Secretaries of State who will provide specialized leadership on key issues and priorities. Click here to view the **new Secretaries of State**.

The Ministry for Seniors has been replaced by a Secretariat of State entrusted to <u>Stéphanie McLean</u>— a decision that raises questions about the priority given to aging-related issues within the government's agenda.

We have therefore asked the national president, Mr. Roy Goodall, to send a letter to the Prime Minister's Office expressing the following points:

- Our surprise at this decision.
- Our request for an explanation regarding the choice of ministerial structure.
- The importance of strong, dedicated, and visible leadership to represent seniors within the Cabinet.
- And our willingness to collaborate with the new Secretary of State, while calling for full recognition of the strategic importance of aging-related issues.

Finally, following the Speech from the Throne delivered by King Charles III on May 27, we will now draw up a list of Members of Parliament to meet with, and a letter outlining our priorities will be sent to them by email.
